

Greetings President Jon

The SLC chapter currently has eleven dues paid contractor members.

During the month of April, a contractor member survey was sent to each member twice, and each member received a telephone call requesting their participation and completion of the survey. The survey was built to assess contractor member interest in various business and industry topics for workshop and meeting topics, as well as workshops or presentations for field workforce, their employees and sub-contracted labor. The survey also included questions to assess contractor member interest in various social events, such as golf tournament, charity painting project, etc. Lastly, the survey assessed the likeliness of contractor and office staff attendance at workshops, meetings and events they selected.

On May 4th, a member dinner meeting was held for chapter update report, to discuss the survey results, whether to continue operating as a chapter and if to continue, to decide on the balance of 2016 educational and social events.

During the dinner meeting, contractor members were asked if they were participating in the Council's offering through Burnett Marketing. Of those present, only one member shared that he had signed up at the personal request of RMC President Jon Yergensen, but had not participated or used any of the offerings. Discussion included that the offering may not be a good fit for most of the contractor members in SLC.

The member survey had a unanimous result to continue operating the chapter. Those present at the meeting discussed and confirmed same. Discussion included the suggestion that the future may include taking a break and putting the chapter on hold, then revisiting starting up again.

Those present discussed the rest of the survey results and agreed to the following programming for the remainder of 2016 and possibly into the beginning of 2017;

- Presentation with State Licensing speaker from DOPL (Utah Division of Occupational & Professional Licensing)
- Contractors Safety Management and possible Safety Training workshop for field workforce
- Fall 2016 Golf Tournament
- Possible additional topic - Field Management for Contractors and Crew Leaders

The members were lead in a discussion regarding the legal entity of the chapter and lack of officers, by Brandt Domas. Since it was decided to continue operations of the chapter, it was decided to have Domas discuss the prospect of having the Council house the Chapter as an entity and establish a separate RMC SLC checking account with the President of the council or other council officer be charged with review of chapter operations and funds on a regular schedule, perhaps quarterly.
